LCDR Jeffrey Mallette received a Bachelor of Science in Mathematics with a minor in Business in 1992 from University of Southern Mississippi. He later earned a Bachelor of Science in Pharmaceutical Sciences from University of Mississippi School of Pharmacy in 1998 and a Doctor of Pharmacy in 2000.

CURRENT JOB DESCRIPTION:

LCDR Mallette currently works for United States Public Health Service (USPHS) as the Chief Pharmacist assigned to the Federal Bureau of Prisons in Federal Prison Camp (FPC), Pensacola, FL. His responsibilities include directing ambulatory care pharmaceutical operations processing over 17,000 prescriptions annually and administering a budget of \$100,000. In addition to his managerial duties, he counsels patients on appropriate use of medications, conducts training for health service staff, and provides pharmacy representation as the recorder and active member of the Pharmacy and Therapeutics Committee. For the past three years he also served as the Chief Pharmacist for both the FPC at Eglin and Pensacola.

QUALIFYING SKILLS FOR CURRENT POSITION:

LCDR Mallette served as an active duty pharmacist in the U.S. Navy for three years before joining the USPHS in 2003. During this time, he worked as an Assistant Department Head for the United States Navy Hospital Health Care System in Corpus Christi, TX. In this capacity he also served as the Operations Manager and Division Officer. His responsibilities included directing a \$5 million outpatient pharmaceutical operation, processing over 200,000 prescriptions per year. He ensured pharmacy operations were consistent with all Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organization regulations and supervised a pharmacy staff of thirty. In addition, LCDR Mallette implemented and managed a \$520,000 pharmacy robotics system, performed drug utilization reviews and played a significant role in developing and maintaining medication formulary for the hospital.

Additional Assignments: LCDR Mallette was temporarily assigned to Naval Air Station, Fort Worth, TX for 3 weeks to help implement the ScriptPRO pharmacy robotics system. Due to his knowledge and expertise LCDR Mallette was requested to temporarily support pharmacist shortages in Kingsville, TX and Ingleside, TX.

REASONS FOR CHOOSING THE USPHS AS A CAREER:

“In pharmacy school, I joined the Navy through a scholarship program prior to learning about PHS. I was drawn to the varying career possibilities in federal service beyond that of a "lick and stick" pharmacist. Once in the Navy, I immediately took great pride in wearing a uniform and serving our country. I also enjoyed the high quality of family life and the great retirement program federal service provides. After researching PHS and talking with several PHS officers at a national pharmacy convention, I quickly realized the uniformed service that was the best fit for me was the Public Health Service, and I got here as quickly as I could.”

MOST REWARDING USPHS PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE:

“The most rewarding experiences are ahead of me, but thus far there have been two experiences that stand out. The first was the 2004 Hurricane Ivan evacuation - we safely and effectively evacuated over 800 inmates in less than 24 hours while accurately processing over 1,100 prescriptions. Second, establishing a pharmacy student ambulatory care rotation site and having the first student go through the program.”
