



TOP[®] Approach to Training, TA, and Fidelity

Description: Five day training.
Frequency: Prior to club implementation and as needed.

Description: Site visit to review bright spots.
Frequency: As needed.

Description: Certified Partners administer pre and post surveys to teens; mid-year and end-of-year for facilitators.
Frequency: Annually.




Description: Site visit to check on fidelity.
Frequency: First year of implementation and every two years thereafter.

Description: Reports for surveys are available on-line.
Frequency: Middle and end-of-year.

Description: Site visit based on concerns.
Frequency: As needed.

Description: Eight hours of technical assistance.
Frequency: Annually.

When: Aug 6 - Oct 3, 2013

Description: To be eligible for a grant under this competition: (a) An applicant must be an individual LEA (as defined in this notice) or a consortium of individual LEAs from one of the 50 States, the District of Columbia, or the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico. (b) LEAs may apply for all or a portion of their schools, for specific grades, or for subject-area bands (e.g., lowest-performing schools, secondary schools, schools connected by a feeder pattern).
