



Replicating Evidence-Based Teen Pregnancy Prevention Programs to Scale in Communities with the Greatest Need (Tier 1B)

Overview of Funded Grant Projects

ARIZONA

Name of Grantee: Child & Family Resources, Inc.

Location: Tucson, AZ

Through the *Mobilization for Positive Futures Project*, the Tucson Teen Pregnancy Prevention Coalition will mobilize the San Xavier and Tucson South communities to provide evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programming to 11,900 youth aged 11-19 over the five-year project. San Xavier and Tucson South are subdivisions of Pima County with especially high teen birth rates – 95.1 per 1,000 girls aged 14-19 in San Xavier and 73.0 per 1,000 in Tucson South. The Coalition will implement *Making a Difference!* for all students in 8th grade, *Reducing the Risk* for all students in 9th grade, and *Be Proud, Be Responsible, Be Protective!* for students who are expectant or parenting. Those students not attending school will receive evidence-based TPP programs at the Mission Manor community-based site.

Name of Grantee: Touchstone Behavioral Health

Location: Tucson, AZ

Touchstone Behavioral Health (TBH) will provide evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs in the southwest Phoenix metropolitan area where the teen birth rate is 79.2 per 1,000 females aged 14-19. In addition to delivering evidence-based TPP programs, TBH will coordinate community, youth, and parent advisory groups; implement community outreach and engagement events; and conduct parent workshops. *¡Cuidate!* and *Making Proud Choices!* will be provided in four settings: (1) a public elementary school district, (2) an alternative charter school, (3) a city government resource center, and (4) a community mental health center. TBH expects to serve 2,500 youth and 250 parents annually.

CALIFORNIA

Name of Grantee: Community Action Partnership of San Luis Obispo County, Inc.

Location: San Luis Obispo, CA

The Community Action Partnership of San Luis Obispo County (CAPSLO) will provide evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs to youth in two rural and two urban communities in San Luis Obispo County. In Paso Robles and Nipomo where the teen birth rate is 29.85 and 47.85 per 1,000, CAPSLO will implement *Making a Difference!* in middle schools, *¡Cuidate!* in high schools, *Be Proud! Be Responsible!* in alternative schools, *Making Proud Choices!* in out of home settings for youth in foster care, and *Be Proud! Be Responsible! Be Protective!* in community settings for expectant and parenting teens. In Santa Maria where the teen birth rate is 39.18, CAPSLO will implement *Cuidate!* in high schools, *Be Proud! Be Responsible!* in alternative school, and *Making Proud Choices!* in out of home settings for youth in foster care. CAPSLO plans to reach 8,900 over the five-year project.

Name of Grantee: Contra Costa Health Services

Location: Martinez, CA

Contra Costa Health Services (CCHS) will implement evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs in the communities of West Contra Costa and Pittsburg, California where the teen birth rates range from 32.6 to 58.3 per 1,000 females aged 15-19 years. CCHS will implement *Be Proud! Be Responsible!* in five high schools and one alternative high school; *Get Real* in seven middle schools; and *Seventeen Days* in one clinic setting. Through the project, CCHS will serve over 7,000 youth each year and more than 28,000 by the end of the five-year project.

Name of Grantee: San Diego Youth Services

Location: San Diego, CA

San Diego Youth Services (SDYS) and five core partners, through *The Community Assessment Team (CAT)+ Project*, will implement evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs to 3,000 youth ages 11-19 annually in eight different settings and at more than 40 sites. Evidence-based TPP programs will be implemented in high schools, middle schools, after-school programs, alternative schools, juvenile detention centers, community-based settings, out-of-home settings, and residential settings within zip codes across San Diego County with teen birth rates ranging from 26.9 to 115.8 per 1,000 teen girls. Through *The CAT+ Project*, SDYS and its partners will implement up to five evidence-based TPP programs, including (1) *Reducing the Risk*, (2) *Project AIM*, (3) *Making Proud Choices!*, (4) *Be Proud! Be Responsible!* and (5) *SHARP*.

Name of Grantee: University of Southern California

Location: Los Angeles, CA

The University of Southern California will work in collaboration with the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health to prevent teenage pregnancy and improve adolescent sexual health in the communities served by the Los Angeles and Compton Unified School Districts (LAUSD and CUSD), through *Keeping It Real Together: Integrating Successful Pregnancy Prevention Programs into Large Urban School Districts and Community Systems (KIR-T)*. *KIR-T* will strive to delay the onset of sexual activity among middle school students by implementing *It's Your Game...Keep It Real* in 7th and 8th grades in up to 55 LAUSD and CUSD middle schools, *Families Talking Together* for parents of middle school youth through the school district Wellness Centers, and *Be Proud! Be Responsible!* in 14 alternative high school educational centers throughout the target community. The teen birth rate across the communities served ranges from 29.1 to 77.9 per 1,000 15-19 year old females. Through *KIR-T*, an estimated 20,000 youth annually and more than 80,000 youth over the five-year project will receive evidence-based TPP programs.

CONNECTICUT

Name of Grantee: City of Hartford

Location: Hartford, CT

The City of Hartford, Connecticut, through its Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), will implement the Hartford Teen Pregnancy Prevention Initiative (HTPPI). The HTPPI will include implementation of evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs in middle schools, high schools and community based organizations across the entire community of Hartford. The teen birth rate in the City of Hartford is 40 per 1,000 girls ages 15-19. Selected evidence-based TPP programs include *Teen Outreach Program*, *Be Proud! Be Responsible!*, and *Get Real*. The City of Hartford plans to serve an average of 1,500 youth per year through the HTPPI.

FLORIDA

Name of Grantee: OIC of South Florida

Location: Fort Lauderdale, FL

Opportunities Industrialization Center of South Florida (OICSFL) and Memorial Healthcare System, will partner to facilitate evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs to youth 13-19 years of age residing in nine zip codes in Broward County, Florida with teen birth rates ranging from 30.4 to 85.5 per 1,000 teen girls. One of three evidence-based TPP programs -- *Becoming a Responsible Teen (BART)*, *Making Proud Choices!* and *Promoting Health Among Teens – Comprehensive (PHAT-C)* will be implemented in eight middle schools, nine high schools, six after-school recreational program sites, and additional community-based sites. Throughout the duration of the five-year program, over 19,200 youth will receive evidence-based TPP programs.

Name of Grantee: Trinity Church, Inc.

Location: Miami, FL

Trinity Church, in collaboration with Hope for Miami, Fit Kids, Inc., and Gang Alternatives, will facilitate evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs to youth 11-19 years of age residing in high-need communities in Miami Dade County, Florida. Trinity Church and its partners will focus on serving youth in 19 zip codes in Miami-Dade County with teen birth rates ranging from 26.6 to as high as 130.6 births per 1,000 teen girls. One of three evidence-based TPP programs -- *Becoming a Responsible Teen (BART)*, *Making Proud Choices*, and *Reducing the Risk* – will be implemented in 11 middle schools, 14 high schools, 2 foster care sites, 1 juvenile detention facility, and 1 community site serving expectant and parenting teens. In total, over 27,000 youth will be served throughout the 5-year program.

GEORGIA

Name of Grantee: Augusta Partnership for Children, Inc.

Location: Augusta, GA

The Augusta Partnership for Children's *CONTINUED CHANGE INITIATIVE* is a five-year Teen Pregnancy Prevention (TPP) initiative that will serve 1,500 youth annually in five counties in East Central Georgia (Richmond, Burke, Jefferson, Washington, and Wilkes). The teen birth rates in these counties ranges from 44.3 to 61.3 per 1,000 teen girls aged 15-19. Within each of the five counties, the *CONTINUED CHANGE INITIATIVE* will utilize four strategies to reduce rates of teen pregnancy and sexually

transmitted infections, including (1) mobilizing the community to support the project, (2) providing capacity building and technical assistance to community partners, (3) implementing evidence-based TPP programs including *Making Proud Choices!*, *Project AIM*, and *FOCUS* in schools, colleges, and a variety of community settings, and (4) developing strong internal and external communication strategies.

Name of Grantee: Morehouse School of Medicine

Location: Atlanta, GA

The Morehouse School of Medicine Teenage Pregnancy Prevention Initiative (MSM-TPPI) will implement evidence-based TPP programs in two rural counties (Crisp and Jasper) and three non-rural counties (Douglas, Spalding, and Thomas) in Georgia with teen birth rates ranging from 31.4 to 50.3 per 1,000 girls ages 15-19. In each county, five evidence-based TPP programs will be implemented in schools, after school, in community-based sites, and in clinics and will include *Be Proud, Be Responsible!*, *Be Proud, Be Responsible, Be Protective!*, *Making a Difference!*, *Teen Outreach Program* and *Seventeen Days*. The MSM-TPPI is expected to reach 3,500 youth each year across the target communities.

Name of Grantee: Quest for Change, Inc.

Location: Decatur, GA

Quest For Change, Inc. is partnering with three rural and low-income school districts to implement the *Success for Life* project with youth in a high need, tri-county region in southwest Georgia that includes Calhoun, Terrell, and Randolph Counties. The teen birth rate in Calhoun County is 98.6 per 1,000 girls ages 15-19; in Terrell is 88.7 per 1,000; and in Randolph is 61.4 per 1,000. Working with schools and community-based organizations, the project will replicate three evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs in at least three settings in each county to serve a minimum of 1,000 youth annually. *Draw The Line/Respect The Line* will be implemented in middle schools, *Making A Difference* in high schools, and additional evidence-based TPP programs for primarily older teens in afterschool and community-based settings. In addition, the project will engage youth through Youth Leadership Councils and will engage parents and key stakeholders through informative workshops and sessions to build capacity for sustaining TPP efforts.

IOWA

Name of Grantee: Planned Parenthood of the Heartland

Location: Des Moines, IA

Planned Parenthood of the Heartland plans to implement evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs in six counties in Iowa and Nebraska through the proposed project. These communities include Woodbury, Pottawattamie, Mills and Page Counties in Iowa and Dakota and Douglas Counties in Nebraska. The teen birth rates across the six counties range from 32.7 to 51.2 per 1,000 teen girls. In each county, Planned Parenthood of the Heartland will implement *Get Real* and *Draw the Line/Respect the Line* in middle schools; *Be Proud! Be Responsible!* and *Making Proud Choices!* in high schools; and *Get Real* and *Draw the Line/Respect the Line* in community-based organizations. Overall, the project will serve 2,775 youth each year.

ILLINOIS

Name of Grantee: Illinois Department of Human Services

Location: Springfield, IL

The Illinois Department of Human Services (IDHS) and its partners will serve 10 communities located outside of Chicago with teen birth rates ranging from 26.8 to 74.9 per 1,000 teen girls. In each community, IDHS and its partners will implement evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs to scale in three settings: 1) elementary and/or middle schools, 2) high schools, and 3) an alternative school or community-based after-school program. The evidence-based TPP programs include *All4You!*, *Be Proud! Be Responsible!*, *Becoming A Responsible Teen (BART)*, *iCuidate!*, *Draw the Line/Respect the Line*, *Making a Difference!*, and *Making Proud Choices!*. IDHS will serve 16,845 youth each year across the 10 communities. Funding will also support multi-sector coalitions and youth leadership councils, referrals to youth-friendly health care services, and strategic communication activities.

INDIANA

Name of Grantee: Healthcare Education and Training, Inc.

Location: Indianapolis, IN

The Health Care Education and Training, (HCET) Clinton County *Youth RISE! (Responsible, Involved, Supported and Educated) Project (YR!)* will implement evidence based positive youth development and teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs to scale in multiple settings in Clinton County, Indiana. Clinton County is a rural community in north central Indiana with a teen birth rate of 46.2 per 1,000 teen girls. The *YR! Project* will engage the existing and diverse Advisory Committee and Youth Leadership Teams and key stakeholders to implement *Raising Healthy Children* in elementary schools, *Teen Outreach Program* in middle schools, *Reducing the Risk* in high school, and *Families Talking Together* in community-based organizations. The *YR! Project* will serve more than 1,500 youth per year.

LOUISIANA

Grantee Name: Institute of Women and Ethnic Studies

Location: New Orleans, LA

The Institute of Women and Ethnic Studies will implement the *Believe in Youth- Louisiana (BY-LA)* program in communities in New Orleans with teen birth rates ranging from 30 to 51 per 1,000 teen girls. Through the *BY-LA* program, at least 4,000 African-American and Latino youth ages 11-19 will receive evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs annually. The goals of the program are to: 1) reduce the rate of teen pregnancy, HIV and other STIs among African American and Latino adolescents ages 11-19 and 2) promote the long-term sustainability of the *BY-LA* program. *BY-LA* will include implementation of *Making Proud Choices!* in middle schools, after school and in community-based organizations (CBOs); *Becoming A Responsible Teen* in CBOs; *Families Talking Together* in CBOs and faith-based organizations; and *Reducing the Risk* in high schools and after school programs.

REPUBLIC OF MARSHALL ISLANDS

Grantee Name: Youth to Youth in Health, Inc.

Location: Majuro, MH

The *RMI Urban Teenage Pregnancy Prevention Project (TPP Project)* is a collaboration between Youth to Youth in Health, the Republic of Marshall Islands (RMI) Ministry of Education, Ministry of Health, and Marshall Islands Epidemiology and Prevention Initiatives. The *RMITPP Project* will work within three urban RMI communities, Majuro, Laura, and Ebeye, which house almost two-thirds of the population and have a teen birth rate of 85 per 1,000 teen girls. In each community, the *RMI TPP Project* will implement evidence based TPP programs in three settings. The programs include *Draw the Line/Respect the Line* in elementary and middle schools, *Reducing the Risk* in high schools, and *Safer Sex* in clinics. Youth to Youth Health expects to reach between 2,000-2,500 youth every year of the five year project.

MARYLAND

Grantee Name: Baltimore City Health Department

Location: Baltimore, MD

Baltimore City's U Choose Coalition, led by the Baltimore City Health Department (BCHD), intends to decrease the overall teen birth rate of 43.3 per 1,000 teen girls by 30 percent by the end of the five-year project through reductions in disparities among African American and Hispanic teens, and to ensure sustainable delivery of evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs in Baltimore City. Through this project, BCHD in partnership with the Baltimore City Schools and a network of seven Title X clinics, plans to reach 15,890 adolescents aged 12-19 each year with evidence-based TPP programs implemented in middle schools, high schools, and Title X clinics in Baltimore City. BCHD will implement *Project AIM* in middle schools, *Be Proud! Be Responsible!* in high schools and *Seventeen Days* in the clinics.

MASSACHUSETTS

Grantee Name: Massachusetts Alliance on Teen Pregnancy

Location: Boston, MA

The Massachusetts Alliance on Teen Pregnancy (the Alliance) will launch *Partners for Lawrence Youth*, an initiative to prevent teen pregnancy and support youth in Lawrence, Massachusetts where the current teen birth rate is 40.9 per 1,000 teen girls. The long-term goals of the project are to reduce STIs and unintended pregnancy, reduce disparities, and promote healthy adolescent development among youth ages 12-19 in Lawrence. *Partners for Lawrence Youth* will incorporate a three-part strategy that includes: 1) Increasing youth access to evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs by implementing programs to scale in at least three settings, 2) mobilizing a community response to teen pregnancy, and 3) increasing youth access to high-quality health care services. The Alliance will serve 6,600 youth over the five-year project.

MINNESOTA

Grantee Name: Hennepin, County of

Location: Minneapolis, MN

The Hennepin County Human Services and Public Health Department's Better Together Hennepin Initiative, It's OUR Future (IOF) project will implement evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs to scale in five diverse communities in Hennepin County with teen birth rates ranging from 31.7 to 60.5 per 1,000 teen girls. The five communities include Brooklyn Center, Central and North Minneapolis, Richfield, and Robbinsdale. The goal of the IOF project is to reduce teen birth rates by 30 percent among adolescents ages 10 to 19 in the five communities served. The IOF project will replicate *Adult Identity Mentoring (Project AIM)* and *Making Proud Choices!* in middle schools, *All4You!* and *Safer Choices* in high schools and alternative schools, and the *Safer Sex Initiative (SSI)* at youth-friendly clinics. Better Together Hennepin expects IOF to reach more than 32,000 youth over the five-year project.

MISSISSIPPI

Name of Grantee: Delta Health Alliance

Location: Stoneville, MS

The Delta Health Alliance through its Delta Futures project will assist nine public school districts and five local Rural Health Clinics across 10 rural counties in replicating evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs in school, clinic, and community settings. The service area includes 10 rural counties in the heart of the Mississippi Delta with teen birth rates ranging from 41.1 to 101.9 per 1,000 teen girls. The Delta Futures Project will implement *Draw the Line/Respect the Line* in middle schools, *Reducing the Risk* in high schools, and *Becoming a Responsible Teen* in rural health clinics. The Delta Futures project plans to serve 8,350 youth over the course of the five-year project.

MISSOURI

Grantee Name: Better Family Life

Location: Saint Louis, MO

Better Family Life, Inc. (BFL) will implement the BFL Teen Pregnancy Prevention (TPP) Program in a high-need community defined by 28 zip codes located in the three adjoining counties of St. Louis City. The teen birth rate for the community is 73.8 births per 1,000 teen girls. Three evidence-based TPP programs will be implemented in middle schools, high schools, and after school with over 4,000 youth each year. BFL and its partners will deliver *Teen Outreach Program* after school with 6th and 7th grade students, *Promoting Health among Teens-Abstinence Only* in middle schools with their 8th grade students, and *Making Proud Choices!* in high schools with their 9th grade students.

NEVADA

Grantee Name: Southern Nevada Health District

Location: Las Vegas, NV

The Southern Nevada Health District (SNHD) will conduct the Southern Nevada Teen Pregnancy Prevention (TPP) Replication Project, serving Clark County, Nevada communities most in need of teen pregnancy prevention. The project will implement evidence-based TPP programs in two Clark County communities within the Cities of Las Vegas and North Las Vegas with an average teen birth rate of 63.8 per 1,000 teen girls. This project will implement *Sexual Health and Adolescent Risk Prevention (SHARP)*, *Families Talking Together*, and *Making Proud Choices* in juvenile detention, community based programs, and out of home placement for youth in foster care. SNHD will reach a minimum of 800 youth per year for a total of 3,200 youth over the five-year project.

NEW YORK

Grantee Name: Cicatelli Associates

Location: New York, NY

Cicatelli Associates, Inc. (CAI) in partnership with the University of Buffalo, Primary Care Research Institute, and the Erie County Department of Health will implement evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs to scale, reaching at least 15,000 youth annually in 9 zip codes in Erie County, New York. The teen birth rate in the areas to be served is 61.3 per 1,000 females aged 15-19. Through this project, CAI and its partners will implement *Raising Healthy Children* in elementary schools; *Making Proud Choices* in junior high schools; *Be Proud! Be Responsible!* in high schools; *All4You!* in an alternative high school; *Seventeen Days, Safer Sex* and *Horizons* in clinics; *Families Talking Together* in community-based organizations, and *SHARP* in a juvenile detention center.

Grantee Name: City of Rochester

Location: Rochester, NY

The City of Rochester Department of Recreation and Youth Services Teenage Pregnancy Prevention (TPP) Program will serve 3,230 youth per year in urban Rochester, New York where the teen birth rate is 49 per 1,000 teen girls. The City of Rochester will partner with the Rochester City School District, City Recreation Sites, the Summer Youth Employment Program, youth residential and juvenile justice programs, youth-friendly health care providers, and homeless shelters to implement evidence-based TPP programs in schools and community settings. The program will replicate the *Teen Outreach Program*, *Making a Difference*, *Making Proud Choices* and *Be Proud! Be Responsible!* in school and after school, and will serve close to 2,000 youth each year.

Name of Grantee: The Children's Aid Society

Location: New York, NY

The Children's Aid Society (CAS) will implement and bring to scale two evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs in District 3 of the Bronx, New York. CAS proposes to leverage the systems that adolescents are already a part of – their schools, community centers and foster care settings – to implement the *CAS-Carrera Adolescent Pregnancy Prevention Program* and *Making Proud Choices!*. The project will target Community District 3 of the Bronx, which has a three-year teen birth rate of 43.1 per 1,000 teen girls. The program will reach an estimated 1,360 youth annually.

Name of Grantee: Fund for Public Health in New York, Inc.

Location: New York, NY

The Fund for Public Health in New York, Inc., in cooperation with the New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene will implement the New York City Teens Connection (NYCTC) program in three communities with high teen birth rates: the South Bronx (42.8 per 1,000), Central Brooklyn (34.2 per 1,000), and Port Richmond, Staten Island (33.3 per 1,000). NYCTC will work through partnerships and existing systems to bring evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention programs to 15,000 young people ages 14-19 each year. In each community, *Reducing the Risk* will be delivered in traditional high schools, *Teen Health Project* will be delivered in transfer and international high schools, and *Seventeen Days* will be delivered in clinics, local colleges, and foster care settings. High schools and foster-care agencies will also be linked to local teen-friendly clinics that provide quality health care services.

Name of Grantee: Oswego County Opportunities, Inc.

Location: Fulton, NY

Oswego County Opportunities, Inc. (OCO) will implement evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs to have a significant impact on the rates of teen pregnancy in the Oswego County, New York. The project will focus specifically on three school districts in Oswego County: Altmar-Parish-Williamstown Central School District, Fulton City School District and Mexico Academy & Central School District. The teen birth rate in each community ranges from 33.5 per 1,000 to 49.1 per 1,000 teen girls. In each school district, OCO will implement *Be Proud! Be Responsible!* and *Making Proud Choices!* in junior high school, high school, and after school settings. Over the course of the five-year project, OCO plans to reach 4,896 youth.

NORTH CAROLINA

Grantee Name: Adolescent Pregnancy Campaign of North Carolina

Location: Durham, NC

The Adolescent Pregnancy Campaign of North Carolina through the *NORTH CAROLINA YOUTH CONNECTED Project* will address teen pregnancy by mobilizing Cumberland County and Onslow County to implement and scale up evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs, other evidence-based practices, and health care linking/referral strategies. The teen birth rate in Cumberland County is 36.3 per 1,000 girls age 15-19 and the teen birth rate in Onslow County is 55.6 per 1,000. Both counties will implement *Project AIM* in middle schools, *Seventeen Days* in clinics, *Making Proud Choices: An Adaptation for Out-of-Home Youth* in the foster care system, and the *Teen Outreach Program* and/or *All4You!* in after-school settings. In addition, Cumberland County will implement *SHARP* in their juvenile detention center, and Onslow County will implement an evidence-based TPP program in high school classrooms. In total, evidence-based TPP programs will be implemented in at least seven settings in each county serving approximately 53,000 youth by the end of the five-year project.

Grantee Name: North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services

Location: Raleigh, NC

The North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services (NC DHHS) Division of Public Health will implement evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs to scale in Edgecombe, Richmond, and Graham counties where the teen birth rates are 29.5, 45 and 55.7 per 1,000 teen girls. The overall goal of the project is to decrease adolescent birth rates in Edgecombe, Richmond, and Graham counties by 10 percent. In each county, NC DHHS will implement *Making Proud Choices* in middle schools, *Reducing the Risk* in high schools, and the *Teen Outreach Program* after school. NC DHHS will reach approximately 2,225 youth per year and more than 11,000 youth over the five-year project.

OHIO

Name of Grantee: Cuyahoga County District Board of Health

Location: Parma, OH

The Cuyahoga County Board of Health (CCBH) will engage community partners through the Cuyahoga County Teen Wellness Initiative to implement evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs with a minimum of 2,000 youth annually to reduce the teen birth rate in Cuyahoga County. CCBH will focus implementation of evidence-based TPP programs in three settings in seven schools districts within the County's eastern suburbs that have teen birth rates ranging from 31.1 to 50.8 per 1,000 teen girls. *Draw the Line/Respect the Line* will be implemented in middle school, *Reducing the Risk* in high school, and *Becoming a Responsible Teen* in the County's Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender Community Center.

OKLAHOMA

Name of Grantee: Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma

Location: Durant, OK

The Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma will implement evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs in Choctaw, McCurtain, and Pushmataha Counties in Oklahoma, all of which have teen birth rates ranging from 61-78 per 1,000 teen girls. The program will be implemented in middle schools, high schools, and alternative schools throughout the three counties in southeast Oklahoma. *Draw the Line/Respect the Line* will be implemented for 6th through 8th grade middle school students; *Safer Choices* will be implemented for 9th and 10th grade high school students; and *All4You!* will be implemented for alternative school students. The Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma plans to reach 4,500 youth annually and more than 18,000 youth over the course of the five-year project.

Name of Grantee: Oklahoma City-County Health Department

Location: Oklahoma City, OK

Oklahoma City-County Health Department, working with the Oklahoma County Teen Pregnancy Prevention (TPP) Collaboration and its partner organizations will replicate evidence-based TPP programs in five education and health care settings located in 10 zip codes in central Oklahoma City

neighborhoods with an average teen birth rate of 83.7 per 1,000 teen girls. Evidence-based TPP programs including *Cuidate!*, *Making Proud Choices*, *Making a Difference*, *Be Proud! Be Responsible!*, *Draw the Line/Respect the Line*, and *Sisters Saving Sisters* will be implemented in elementary and middle schools (6-8th grades), high schools, colleges, and health clinics. The project will reach 4,700 youth between the ages of 12-19 annually.

Grantee Name: Youth Services of Tulsa, Inc.

Location: Tulsa, OK

Youth Services of Tulsa (YST), the Tulsa Campaign to Prevent Teen Pregnancy, and Community Service Council have formed a robust partnership – the Tulsa Area Teen Pregnancy Prevention (TPP) Collaborative – to collectively advance efforts to prevent teen pregnancy in Tulsa, Oklahoma where the teen birth rate is 37.3 per 1,000 teen girls. The Collaborative will deliver five diverse evidence-based TPP programs, including *Making Proud Choices*, *Making a Difference*, *SHARP*, *CAS-Carrera* and *Seventeen Days*, in middle school, high school, alternative school, juvenile detention, community-based, and clinic settings. Through this project, the Tulsa Area TPP Collaborative will reach 6,000 youth per year initially and will grow their reach to nearly 10,000 youth per year by grant year five. The Collaborative will also increase the number of youth receiving health care services by increasing the number of referrals and the capacity of area providers to offer youth-friendly services.

OREGON

Name of Grantee: Multnomah County Health Department

Location: Portland, OR

The Multnomah County Health Department (MCHD) will partner with Planned Parenthood Columbia Willamette to implement *Adolescents and Communities Together (ACT)*. Through this project, MCHD will serve 12,870 youth each year in Multnomah County, Oregon. In Multnomah County, the teen birth rate for African American youth is 40.5 per 1,000 females aged 15-19, 47.2 for Latino youth, and 29.7 for Native American youth. *ACT* will implement evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs in middle school (6th, 7th, and 8th grades), high school, and in culturally specific community-based settings. The curricula proposed for these settings include *Get Real* for middle school; *Be Proud! Be Responsible!* and *All4You!* for high school; and *iCuidate!*, *SiHLE*, *Becoming a Responsible Teen (BART)*, *All4You!*, and *Families Talking Together* (for parents) in community settings.

SOUTH CAROLINA

Name of Grantee: South Carolina Campaign to Prevent Teen Pregnancy

Location: Columbia, SC

The South Carolina Campaign to Prevent Teen Pregnancy (SC Campaign) will work with local organizations in Aiken, Anderson, and Orangeburg Counties, where the teen birth rates range from 32.1 to 41.5 per 1,000 teen girls, to implement evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs. Work in each county will be guided by an experienced SC Campaign Capacity Building Specialist, a strategically selected local coordinating agency, a community advisory group, and a youth leadership

team. In each county, evidence-based TPP programs will be implemented in multiple settings including middle schools, high schools, alternative schools, clinics, juvenile detention, and foster care. Evidence-based TPP programs will include *Draw the Line/Respect the Line*, *Making a Difference*, *Making Proud Choices*, *Reducing the Risk*, *Seventeen Days*, *Rikers Health Advocacy Program*, and *SHARP*. Over the course of the five year project, a minimum of 24,000 youth will be served across the three counties.

Name of Grantee: The Children’s Council

Location: Lancaster, SC

The Children’s Council will partner with the Lancaster School District and University of South Carolina-Lancaster to implement evidence based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs in Lancaster County, South Carolina where the teen birth rate is 37.5 per 1,000 girls ages 15-19. The Children’s Council will implement *Making a Difference* in five middle schools, *Making Proud Choices* in four high schools, and *Seventeen Days* with female college freshman at the University of South Carolina - Lancaster. The Children’s Council plans to serve more than 2,100 youth each year.

Name of Grantee: The Mary Black Foundation

Location: Spartanburg, SC

The Mary Black Foundation (MBF) will implement a coordinated, community-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) program in Spartanburg County, South Carolina where rates of teen births range from 32.9 to 42.7 per 1,000 girls ages 15-19. MBF will coordinate with collaborative partners to implement evidence-based TPP programs in Spartanburg County through school-based, clinic-based, and community-based settings. *Project AIM* will be implemented in middle schools, *Seventeen Days* will be implemented in clinics, and several programs will be implemented with vulnerable youth in community-based settings, including *Making a Difference*, *Making Proud Choices*, *Be Proud! Be Responsible!*, *SiHLe* and *Be Proud, Be Responsible, Be Protective*. Through this project, MBF will serve over 3,000 youth each year.

SOUTH DAKOTA

Name of Grantee: Rural America Initiatives

Location: Rapid City, SD

Rural America Initiative through the Ateyapi Teen Outreach Program will serve the American Indian community in Pennington County, South Dakota. The teen birth rate for American Indians in Pennington County is 87.8 per 1,000 females ages 15-19. The Ateyapi Teen Outreach Program will replicate the evidence-based *Teen Outreach Program* in schools, in an alternative high school, and after school. Rural America Initiatives will serve 725 youth per year for a total of 3,625 over the course of the five-year grant period.

TENNESSEE

Name of Grantee: Centerstone of Tennessee, Inc.

Location: Nashville, TN

Centerstone of Tennessee's *Be in Charge 2 (BiC2) Program* will implement evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs for 15,000 youth ages 10-19 each year throughout 85 counties spanning three states. The service area includes 60 counties in Tennessee with teen birth rates as high as 70.3 per 1,000 girls ages 15-19, 14 counties in Kentucky with teen birth rates as high as 82.8 per 1,000, and 11 counties in Indiana with teen birth rates as high as 53.6 per 1,000. Evidence-based TPP programs including *Be Proud! Be Responsible!*, *Making a Difference!*, and *Sexual Health and Adolescent Risk Prevention (SHARP)* will be implemented in middle school, high school, community-based organizations, juvenile detention, foster care, and outpatient clinic settings throughout the 85 county service area.

Name of Grantee: Douglas-Cherokee Economic Authority, Inc.

Location: Morristown, TN

Douglas-Cherokee Economic Authority, Inc. will implement evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs in Hamblen and Hancock Counties, two small, rural Appalachian counties located in East and Northeast Tennessee with teen birth rates of 56.2 and 50.3 per 1,000 girls ages 15-19. In each county, the *Teen Outreach Program* will be implemented in middle schools, high schools, and alternative schools. Over 1,550 students in the 6th through 9th grades enrolled in each target counties' middle, high and alternative schools will be served each year. The project will use a positive youth development approach to teenage pregnancy prevention, combining an interactive classroom-based curriculum with community service learning and counseling/referral services.

Name of Grantee: Le Bonheur Community Health and Well-Being

Location: Memphis, TN

Le Bonheur Community Health and Well-Being will implement evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs for 3,000 to 5,000 youth ages 11-19 in Shelby and Memphis Counties each year. Teen birth rates in Shelby and Memphis Counties are 54.5 per 1,000 and are the highest of any urban county in Tennessee. Through this project, Le Bonheur will implement *Be Proud! Be Responsible!* in middle schools, high schools, alternative schools, and community-based sites reaching 20,000 youth over the five-year project period. In addition, Le Bonheur will initiate a community-wide TPP planning process in partnership with Memphis Teen Vision, an existing coalition of youth serving agencies and providers, to enhance the program and develop a referral process to increase youth access to health care services.

TEXAS

Name of Grantee: Project Vida Health Center

Location: El Paso, TX

Project Vida Health Center (PVHC), through the *POWER 4-Uth* program will implement evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs for 1,600 youth annually in two communities in southeast El Paso County. The two communities to be served are Socorro and Montana Vista, both are

predominately rural, Hispanic, and lacking community resources. Their teen birth rates are 51.9 and 42.7 per 1,000 girls ages 15-19. The *Teen Outreach Program* will be implemented in middle schools, high schools, and community-based settings by trained Promotoras. The *POWER 4-Uth* program will also offer additional support services for youth and their families.

Name of Grantee: Community Action Corporation of South Texas

Location: Alice, TX

The Community Action Corporation of South Texas (CACOST) will reduce the rate of teen pregnancy and sexually transmitted infections in Brooks, Duval, Jim Hogg and Jim Wells Counties in South Texas through the South Texas Teen Leadership and Development Project. The teen birth rates in each of the proposed communities is more than three times the national average: Brooks – 128 per 1,000; Duval – 83 per 1,000; Jim Hogg – 112 per 1,000; and Jim Wells – 83 per 1,000. In each county, CACOST will implement the *Teen Outreach Program* in middle schools and high schools and the *Safer Sex Intervention* in clinics. Over the course of the five-year project, more than 3,800 youth will receive evidence-based TPP programs.

Name of Grantee: The Dallas Foundation

Location: Dallas, TX

The North Texas Alliance to Reduce Teen Pregnancy (NTARuPT), a component of The Dallas Foundation, will provide evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs to an average of 1,500 young people per year in five zip codes in Dallas, Texas. The five target zip codes have teen birth rates ranging from 84.2 to 112.9 per 1,000 girls ages 15-19, and the teen birth rate recently increased in four of the five zip codes. The NTARuPT will deliver the evidenced-based TPP programs *Families Talking Together* and *Making Proud Choices* after school, in community settings, and for youth in out-of-home settings. The goal of the project is to reduce teen pregnancy across the five zip codes by 20 percent by the end of year five.

Name of Grantee: The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio

Location: San Antonio, TX

The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio- UT Teen Health will partner with community youth serving organizations and the San Antonio Teen Pregnancy Prevention Collaborative to implement evidence based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs for approximately 17,550 youth under age 20 annually in Bexar County, Texas. The teen birth rate in Bexar County is 40 per 1,000 females aged 15-19. Partners in this initiative will implement the evidence-based TPP programs in middle schools, high schools, after school programs, faith-based organizations, and in community settings with especially vulnerable youth including expectant and parenting teens, youth in juvenile detention, and youth in foster care. Evidence-based TPP programs will include: *Be Proud! Be Responsible! Be Protective!*; *¡Cuidate!*; *Draw the Line/Respect the Line*; *It's Your Game...Keep It Real*; *Making a Difference!*; *Promoting Health Among Teens –Abstinence Only*; *Promoting Health Among Teens – Comprehensive*; *Reducing the Risk*; *SHARP*; and the *Teen Outreach Program*.

WASHINGTON

Name of Grantee: Planned Parenthood of Greater Washington and North Idaho

Location: Yakima, WA

Planned Parenthood of Greater Washington and Northern Idaho (PPGWNI), along with more than 40 formal partners in the Inland Northwest Healthy Youth Collaborative will implement evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs to scale in four high need communities in Washington. The communities, along with their teen birth rates, include Yakima County (54.2 per 1,000), Franklin County (49.5), Okanogan County (48.9), and City of Spokane (42.2). In each community served, PPGWNI will implement evidence-based TPP programs in high schools, community-based organizations, juvenile detention facilities, and health clinics. Potential evidence-based TPP programs include: (1) high schools – *Reducing the Risk, Safer Choices, Teen Outreach Program, and All4You*; (2) community-based – *iCuidate!* and *Hip Teens*; (3) juvenile detention – *Rikers* and *SHARP*; and (4) health clinics – *Families Talking Together* and *Hip Teens*. PPGWNI intends to serve 500 youth in each community for a total of 2,000 youth per year.

Name of Grantee: Planned Parenthood of the Great Northwest

Location: Seattle, WA

The Northwest Coalition for Adolescent Health (NWCAH), a group of seven Planned Parenthood affiliates covering seven states and a large portion of the western United States, will bring evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs to scale in seven high-need communities. The *NWCAH Implementing Teen Pregnancy Programs to Scale*, will reach approximately 2,275 youth annually, for a total of 9,100 over the five-year project period. The seven communities and their corresponding teen birth rates include: Caldwell, Idaho (28.5 per 1,000); Salem, Oregon (28.9); South Salt Lake City, Utah (64.8); Centralia, Washington (37.4); Tacoma, Washington (46); North Highline region of King County, Washington (62.2); and Mount Vernon, Washington (52.5). In each community, NWCAH will implement evidence-based TPP programs in schools, after-school and at community-based sites, and in clinics. Key stakeholders, community partners, and youth have selected a wide range of evidence-based TPP programs to implement within each community.

WISCONSIN

Name of Grantee: Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Milwaukee

Location: Milwaukee, WI

Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Milwaukee (B&GC) and its partners, Community Advocates, Milwaukee Public Schools, and United Way of Greater Milwaukee & Waukesha County, will implement evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention programs to youth 11-19 years of age in communities of high need with teen birth rates ranging from 31.3 to 88 births per 1,000 teen girls. B&GC and its partners will provide education to youth ages 19 and younger in seven high schools, 20 middle schools, nine after-school recreational program sites, and one jail utilizing *Making Produce Choices!*, *Promoting Health Among Teens – Comprehensive*, and *Promoting Health Among Teens – Abstinence-Only*. On average, the project will serve 3,000 youth annually in six high need zip codes in Milwaukee.

WEST VIRGINIA

Name of Grantee: Mission West Virginia

Location: Hurricane, WV

Mission West Virginia and partner sites Community Action of Southeast West Virginia, Rainelle Medical Center, and Regeneration, Inc. will implement evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention (TPP) programs for youth 10-19 years of age residing in high-need communities across 19 counties in rural West Virginia Appalachia with teen birth rates ranging from 32.0 to 81 per 1,000 girls ages 15-19. *Making Proud Choices* and *Draw the Line/Respect the Line* will be implemented in 42 middle schools, 42 high schools, two after-school recreational program sites, six juvenile justice centers, 11 alternative schools, and two foster care centers. A total of 54,000 youth will receive evidence-based TPP programs throughout the duration of the five-year program.
