## Home Health Quality Measures – Potentially Avoidable Events

Notes:

- Risk Adjustment: All Potentially Avoidable Event measures are risk adjusted. The risk adjustment methodology, using a predictive model developed specifically for each measure, compensates for differences in the patient population served by different home health agencies. The predictive model for the measure "Development of Urinary Tract Infections" did not meet the arbitrary criteria R2 >= 0.10 or C-statistic >= 0.70. This measure is designated with a pound sign (#) to highlight the fact that it has less robust risk adjustment.
- 2. "Quality Episode" Definition: Quality episodes are used in the calculation of the quality measures. Quality episodes are not the same as payment, or Prospective Payment System (PPS) episodes. A quality episode begins with either a SOC or ROC and ends with a transfer, death, or discharge for a patient regardless of the length of time between the start and ending events.
