The CJR Model Toolkit 3.0 is now available on <u>CJR Connect</u>! Download and share it with your colleagues today.

The Toolkit includes a compilation of change concepts, strategies, tactics, tools, and resources used by CJR participant hospitals to support their CJR model implementation, improvement, and sustainability efforts. The Toolkit was updated based on data collected by the CJR Learning System from a subset of participant hospitals during Performance Years 1-5.

This version was published prior to the start of Performance Years 6-8 and, therefore, does not provide technical guidance for the changes outlined in the May 2021 Final Rule (e.g., revised payment methodology and the inclusion of outpatient procedures).
