# **Antibiotic Resistance (AR)**

- Health Impacts
  - At least 2 million illnesses each year that are resistant to antibiotics
  - 23,000 deaths due to antibiotic resistant bacteria
  - > 250,000 illnesses and ~ 15,000 deaths due to *clostridium difficile* infections each year
- Health Costs
  - Estimated \$20-35 billion annually
- As bacteria develop new ways to resist antibiotics, we lose the ability to treat and prevent both common and serious infections
  - Antibiotics are among the most commonly prescribed drugs
  - Up to 50% of the time antibiotics are not optimally prescribed, often done so when not needed, or at an incorrect dose or duration
  - In recent years we have seen the emergence of a number of resistant organisms and a reduction in the utility of a number of antimicrobials

# The U.S. Government Response

- HHS is engaged in a comprehensive, Administration-wide effort under the CARB National Action Plan that aims to:
  - 1. Slow the Emergence of Resistant Bacteria and Prevent the Spread of Resistant Infections
  - 2. Strengthen National One-Health Surveillance Efforts to Combat Resistance
  - 3. Advance Development and Use of Rapid and Innovative Diagnostic Tests for Identification and Characterization of Resistant Bacteria
  - 4. Accelerate Basic and Applied Research and Development for New Antibiotics, Other Therapeutics, and Vaccines
  - 5. Improve International Collaboration and Capacities for Antibiotic-resistance Prevention, Surveillance, Control, and Antibiotic Research and Development

#### Presidential Advisory Council on Combating Antibiotic-Resistant Bacteria



- Group of non-government experts that provide advice, information, and recommendations to the Secretary regarding programs and policies intended to support and evaluate the implementation of U.S. government activities related to combating antibiotic-resistant bacteria.
- Has issued four sets of recommendations to date: two reports, and two resolution letters with recommendations





#### **Federal CARB Task Force**

- Responsible for implementing CARB National Action Plan
- Co-chaired by the Secretaries of HHS, USDA, and DoD
- ASPE serves as the HHS lead for the Task Force

# **HHS Efforts**

- HHS activities focus on the following:
  - Tracking the problem and identifing emerging threats
  - Preventing infections and preventing the spread of resistance
  - Improving antibiotic prescribing and stewardship
  - Developing new diagnostics and medical treatments (including basic, translation, and clinical research to inform new development)
  - Coordination with foreign governments, multilateral organizations, and private sector partners
