## **Immunization Equity Charge**

- 1. Review and summarize the complex and interrelated factors that contribute to vaccination disparities such as access, affordability, awareness, acceptance, and activation.
- 2. Deliver a set of system-wide recommendations for overcoming drivers of immunization disparities and reducing gaps in coverage that will provide the foundation for development of a collaborative immunization equity strategy.
- 3. Report findings for a vote during the **September 2020 meeting**.



## **Previous Work**

- Participated in several planning meetings
- Reviewed previous NVAC recommendations related to reducing disparities
- Examined data from CDC on immunization disparities in adults
- Heard from experts in vaccine confidence about disparities in a variety of populations



## **Future Topics**

- Literature review of immunization disparities and how to encourage ulletequity
- Health literacy and other issues related to vaccine acceptance, like needle phobias, and access or financing issues
- Factors contributing to disparities in
  - racial and ethnic groups,
  - rural, urban, religious and cultural groups,
  - different genders and ages,
- Review more data, effective policy actions, and identify gaps in research
- Are there other topics or research the subgroup should identify?
