Used the TAB key to navigate or fill out a form.	Used voice control or dictation to perform a task.	Encountered flashing or rapid changing content.	Encountered charts, flows, or maps that did not clearly distinguish its categories.	Used a table of contents or search feature to locate content on a page or screen.
Read content with abbreviations, acronyms, jargon, or symbols that were not defined.	Encountered a graphic or chart that was lacking a description to increase understandability.	Required to use a specific software or version of software to access content.	Benefited from an underline or colored area denoting the current selection or active item (i.e., menu item).	Found instructions that relied solely on shape, color, sound, or location to complete a task (i.e., "click the red button").
Viewed a picture with a dense amount of text.	Used the enter / return or spacebar key to perform an action (i.e., activate a link or button).	Found color combinations difficult to perceive content.	Encountered a form submission error, but no suggestion for resolution.	Encountered a confusing or inconsistent navigation structure.
Relied on speech output to perform a task or listened to an audio book.	Loaded a page or application that automatically began playing audio and/or video.	Used a built-in or automated checker to establish a baseline of conformance.	Used keyboard shortcuts (i.e., CTRL+S or ALT+TAB) to perform tasks	Used a track changes or comments feature to provide collaborative feedback.
Used an application or kiosk to perform a task (i.e., order items, checkout at a store).	Used zoom in functions to read content more easily.	Was not able to extend a time-limit to complete a task.	Took more than one attempt to complete a CAPTCHA challenge (i.e., find all the pictures of a car).	Turned on or viewed captions to follow video content.
