STATEMENT OF WORK

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The current COVID-19 pandemic demands action in developing life-saving protective and therapeutic products. Lifesaving protective and therapeutic products are items such as vaccines, which protect humans from deadly pathogens, or therapeutics or 'therapies' which can treat a human from the impacts of deadly pathogens. This document provides a summary of the buckets of activity where specialized support is required to ensure the JPEO can accomplish the mission at hand and deliver doses of vaccines and therapeutics, also known as 'medicines' to DOD personnel and the nation. As the situation is dynamic, it is anticipated that additional modifications will be needed, to account for the changing nature of the COVID-19 pandemic.

STRATEGIC COMMUNICATIONS

BCG support is integral to the success of the DOD particularly from an Operation Warp Speed (OWS) vantage. (b) (4)

From a DOD perspective, BCG support is necessary to provide critical strategic messaging. These communications will be vertically through DOD and horizontally across OWS, and pertain to the various vaccine and therapeutic efforts in our portfolio. Therapeutic efforts include the monoclonal antibodies and SARS-COV2 polyclonals. Target audiences include OWS leadership and DOD leadership from the JPEO to Deputy Secretary of Defense, to the Secretary of Defense himself. Consistency of messaging is critical and BCG support will be necessary to integrate with current reporting structures in place, as well as bridging the divide between reporting at the tactical level and strategic interagency level. Specific activities will include preparation for and participation in senior leadership DOD/OWS/interagency meetings, debriefing JPEO on OWS activities, development of briefings, information papers, and other supporting documentation, which are in high demand at this point in time.

TASKERS

In the current environment, short turn suspense taskers are an almost daily occurrence. Support from BCG is required to assist in running these information taskers to ground. These may include (but are not limited to), information requests, representation of JPEO at interagency meetings, participation in OWS meetings and cover the topic areas of vaccine and therapeutic development efforts, clinical trials and manufacturing. Taskers can be anywhere from short term (hours) to mid-term (days) and are of such a nature that an individual integrated into the OWS effort is uniquely suited to complete.

PROGRAM MANAGEMENT ACTIVITIES

The increased volume of activity from baseline is enormous. Our team is staffed to handle the day to day tactical execution of activities, but BCG is required to assist with managing and organizing the overarching strategic activities within JPEO EB senior leadership. Specific activities include, but are not limited to, daily coordination and integration of DOD and OWS calendars, coordination and

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integration of OWS/interagency meetings, maintenance and management of tasker lists, team communications and delegation of support.

SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS

1.BCG shall provide strategic guidance and organizational structure for the vaccine acceleration projectincluding aligning strategic messages as well as programmatic accomplishment with OWS. 2.BCG shall optimize organizational processes to allow for improved results.

3.BCG shall drive portfolio alignment with Antibody products within OWS therapeutic efforts.

4.BCG shall assist with portfolio analysis of Antibody therapeutic products for best product

developmentstrategies, manufacturing opportunities, and product roll out.

5.BCG shall conduct gap analysis critic necessary for personnel to achieve vaccine acceleration goals andleadership expectations.

QASP

QUALITY ASSURANCE SURVEILLANCE PLAN

1. Objective. This Quality Assurance Surveillance Plan (QASP) serves as the principal basis for assessing overall performance quality. This document will be used by the Government to assess the effectiveness of the Contractor's technical services. This QASP provides the methodology by which the Contractor's performance will be monitored to determine compliance with established performance objectives and to establish performance benchmarks that ensure a quantifiable basis for measuring effectiveness. The plan is designed so that surveillance is limited to that which is necessary to verify the Contractor is performing technical services satisfactorily and relates directly to performance objectives of the performance objectives delineated in the SOW.

2. Government Surveillance. The Contracting Officer will appoint a technical representative to function as the Technical Representative for this contract, and her/his authority will be limited to administering specific technical aspects of the contract. The Contracting Officer's Technical Representative (COTR) will not provide direction that is outside the scope of responsibilities delineated under this contract and will defer any conditional interpretations to the Contracting Officer. The COTR will:

- Maintain a detailed knowledge of the technical requirements of the contract;
- Document Contractor performance in accordance with the QASP;
- Identify and immediately forward notifications of deficient, or noncompliant performance to the Contracting Officer;
- Approve priorities of support, resources, and associated schedules.

3. Surveillance Methods. Surveillance of Contractor performance is the method used by the Government to determine whether the contractor is effectively and efficiently complying with all terms and conditions of the contract. The functional expertise of the COTR plays a critical role in adequately evaluating contractor performance.

4. Objectives. This contract incorporates the following objectives: The proposed effort is for COVID-19 Support Services for JPEO-CBRND-EB.

It is the contractor's responsibility to employ the necessary resources to ensure accomplishment of these objectives. The Government's assessment of the contractor's performance in achieving these objectives will utilize the standards, acceptable quality levels, and surveillance methods described in the Performance Requirements Summary matrix set forth below.

The contractor will be notified, in writing, of the Government's determination of its

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performance level for each performance objective, including all instances where the contractor failed to meet the acceptable quality level.


