

Pilot Projects

	Proposals that meet key reqs	Evaluated on these criteria
Responsive	Address Roundtable's priority area	Address PCP or NVAC recommendation
Collaborative	Be implemented by Roundtable members, possibly with a vendor	Facilitate collaboration between different groups, and link cancer prevention and immunization expertise
Impactful	Affect measurable outcomes	Address important and clearly articulated problem, i.e. pass the "so what test"
Feasible	Have a one year timeline for completion, within a budget of \$30,000	Be likely to be completed on time
Novel	Be difficult to do outside of the Roundtable	Offer a novel solution to the problem identified
