As part of our role within the White House Council on Native American Affairs (WHCNAA), the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) and other federal departments and agencies of the WHCNAA Health Committee including the Department of Homeland Security, the Department of the Interior, and the Department of Veteran Affairs invite you to participate in a Nation-to-Nation dialogue on the ongoing COVID-19 response.

The dialogue will inform the work of the WHCNAA Health Committee to develop expeditiously an interagency plan to improve health systems, infrastructure, and to prepare for the ongoing COVID -19 and future Public Health Emergencies in Indian Country.

I invite you to join us for a two-day virtual Nation-to-Nation dialogue to share your input, recommendations, and perspectives on how federal resources and assistance can best support Tribes' response to Public Health Emergencies and improve health systems across Indian Country. The virtual dialogue will also provide a valuable opportunity for federal agencies to share information about existing resources, including those newly created through COVID supplemental funding and demonstrate coordinated inter-agency response.
